Information for Study Day Volunteers

The BMUS Student & Trainee Volunteer programme is open to all registered **BMUS Student members**.

This is a great opportunity for ultrasound students and trainees to join BMUS and attend BMUS Study Days throughout the year **for free**. Volunteers can participate in educational sessions, earn CPD points, and gain valuable insights from ultrasound experts.

BMUS requires 1 volunteer at each lecture-based study day, and multiple volunteer models for practical training days.

Volunteer at lecture-based study days assist with:

- Event registration - handing out packs to delegates upon their arrival at registration,
- Refreshment breaks - assisting in directing delegates to the refreshments during breaks, and ushering them in before the start of lectures,
- Assistance during Q&A's - passing the microphone around the room during Q&A's,
- Lights - dimming and brightening the lights; dimming at the start of the lecture, and brightening during Q&A's.

Volunteer models at practical study days assist with:

- Acting as models for practical scanning,
- Event registration - handing out packs to delegates upon their arrival at registration,
- Refreshment breaks - assisting in directing delegates to the refreshments during breaks, and ushering them in before the start of lectures,
- Assistance during Q&A's - passing the microphone around the room during Q&A's,
- Lights - dimming and brightening the lights; dimming at the start of the lecture, and brightening during Q&A's.

NOTE:

To volunteer as a model for practical training study days:

- You must be willing to be scanned in the relevant body area (e.g., liver for a Hepatology study day; shoulder for an MSK study day).
- Models must wear appropriate clothing for scanning and be comfortable being scanned by expert practitioners or app specialists.
- BMUS will provide a t-shirt, but models should also bring unrestrictive trousers/skirts and wear a vest under the t-shirt.

- CPD certificates will be issued for attendance.

The aim of the day is to offer a refresher and introduce new thoughts in native renal tract imaging and pathologies, lower genitourinary (GU) systems and transplant imaging. The day will be aimed at sonographers and radiologists-in-training, or anyone with a special interest in GU imaging. A variety of topics will be included throughout the day including: cross-sectional image interpretation for the general sonographer or beginner; use of diagnostic and therapeutic ultrasound in urinary tract stones; nephrology and acute kidney imaging (AKI); update on urology malignancy imaging techniques; advanced assessment of the prostate; ultrasound of the scrotum and the European testicular microlithiasis guidelines. This will be a lecture only study day.

Volunteer Model

Consent Form

BMUS Consent Form for Ultrasound Scanning for the Purposes of Teaching and/or Demonstration

Participation in workshops, study days, conferences or for other teaching or demonstration purposes is voluntary. It is recommended that consent is obtained by the person responsible for the scanning session.

The volunteer model should read the statements below and sign the form if he/she is in agreement with them and is willing to accept their implications.

- The potential hazards of ultrasound have been explained to me;
- I understand that I may withdraw my participation in the scanning at any time, without the need to justify my decision;
- I understand that personal/ medical information may be revealed on the ultrasound monitor, and will be witnessed by those present;
- To the best of my knowledge I am not pregnant. I understand that the scan will cease if a pregnancy is found;
- I understand that there exists the possibility of finding an unsuspected abnormality, or pathology, during the scanning process, which will be revealed to those present;
- In the event of such an abnormality being discovered as a result of the scan, I agree that I should be informed of the abnormality, that a relevant medical practitioner, or GP, may be contacted, and that I may be referred, if necessary, to the appropriate clinician;
